Dear Aimee,

Thank you very much for taking the time to discuss DCP's comments this morning. There were 2 items which were discussed which need to be captured in this communication:

1. Per your request, you needed DCP to submit a request to revise the language associated with the Trace Erase System to indicate instead an "analyzer catalytic oxidizer system such as Trace Erase or the equivalent".
2. As we discussed, I noticed an error in DCP's comments in the Project Description of the SOB. DCP proposed *"The facility throughput may exceed 75,000 bpd and is dependent on the inlet NGL composition without exceeding the CO2e emissions estimated in the GHG PSD permit application."*

DCP notes that **the facility** should identify **each train of the facility** and therefore requests the proposed language to be modified to ***"The throughput of an individual train may exceed 75,000 bpd and is dependent on the inlet NGL composition without exceeding the CO2e emissions estimated in the GHG PSD permit application."*** This same comment is applicable to the Draft GHG PSD permit where in the fourth sentence of the Project Description, DCP also suggested *"The facility throughput.."*. Please revise to *"The throughput of an individual train may not exceed..."*

If there are any other issues that need to be addressed, please let me know or if the above is insufficient, don't hesitate to contact me.
