ANNOUNCEMENT OF FINAL DECISION TO ISSUE A CLEAN AIR ACT PREVENTION OF SIGNIFICANT DETERIORATION PERMIT THAT REGULATES THE EMISSION OF AIR POLLUTANTS PERMIT APPLICATION NO. PSD-TX-110557-GHG

On August 7, 2013, the United States Environmental Protection Agency, Region 6 (EPA) provided notice of, and requested public comment on, EPA's proposal to issue a Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) major permit authorizing the construction of two new natural gas liquids (NGL) fractionation trains (Project) at the DCP Midstream – Jefferson County NGL Fractionation Plant location. EPA's final decision grants conditional approval, in accordance with the PSD regulations (40 CFR 52.21), to DCP Midstream to construct and operate two new NGL fractionation trains with amine treating, natural gasoline treating, molecular sieve dehydration utilizing regeneration heaters, hot oil heaters as the primary heat source, refrigerant propylene and wet surface air coolers/condensers (WSAC) for cooling and condensation, a thermal oxidizer (TO) for control of waste gas streams, and a flare.

The mailing address for DCP Midstream is 662 S. Shelby, Carthage, TX 75633. The proposed location for the Project is on Hildebrandt Road 3.2 miles North of the Steinhagen Road (Humble Camp Road) intersection, or 2.8 miles West and South of the intersection of Hillebrandt Road and W. Port Arthur Road (TX-93 Spur) in Beaumont, Texas 77707.

During the public comment period, EPA received written comments regarding its proposed PSD permitting action for the Project. EPA has carefully reviewed each of the comments submitted and, after consideration of the expressed views of all commenters, the pertinent Federal statutes and regulations, and additional material relevant to the application and contained in our Administrative Record, EPA has made a decision in accordance with 40 CFR 52.21 to issue a final PSD permit to DCP Midstream.

Within 30 days after the service of notice announcing this final permit decision, any person who filed comments on the proposed permit for the Project or participated in any of the public hearings for the Project may petition EPA's Environmental Appeals Board (EAB) to review any condition of the final permit. Persons who did not file comments or participate in the public hearings may petition for administrative review only to the extent of changes from the proposed to the final permit decision. The petition must include a statement of the reason(s) for requesting review by the EAB, including a demonstration that any issues being raised were raised during the public comment period to the extent required by the regulations at 40 CFR Part 124 and when appropriate, a showing that the conditions in question are based on 1) a finding of fact or conclusion of law which is erroneous, or 2) an exercise of discretion or an important policy consideration which the EAB should, in its discretion, review. Please see 40 CFR 124.19 and visit http://www.epa.gov/eab/ for important information regarding the procedures for appeal of a PSD permit decision to the EAB.

EPA's PSD permit for the Project shall take effect thirty (30) days from the date of service of notice of this permit decision unless a petition for review is properly and timely filed with the EAB. In the event that a petition for review is filed with the EAB, construction of the facility is not authorized under this PSD permit until resolution of the EAB petition(s).
