## Site History

- The site is an auto repair shop located at 603 Broadway Street in the city of Fresno, California. It lies at the western corner of Broadway and Ventura Streets.
- The site was occupied by a service station from 1937 to 1982, when the underground storage tanks (USTs) ceased operating and the site became an automotive repair shop.
- Four USTs are present onsite. These consist of three gasoline USTs—(2) 4,000- and (1) 5,000-gallons—and one waste-oil UST—280-gallons.
- Fresno County Department of Public Health requires a site assessment including the removal of the abandoned USTs and investigation of any contamination that may have occurred from holes or leaks in the tanks.
- The State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) identified the site and recommended it receive funding as part of their Abandoned Underground Storage Tank Initiative. Site assessment activities are being conducted by U.S. EPA's Targeted Brownfields Assessment Program.

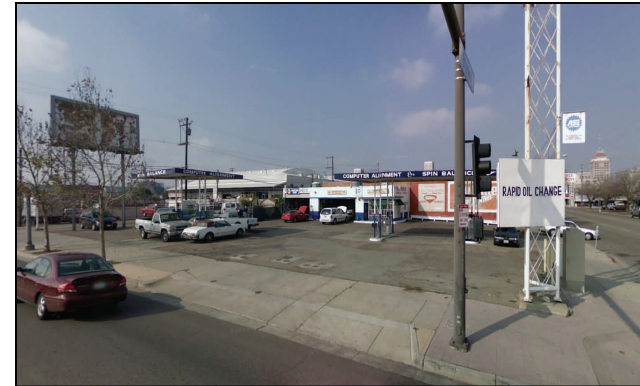

## We Try Hard To Be A Good Neighbor...

In order to assess the environmental condition of the property, four abandoned underground storage tanks (USTs)\* will be removed from 603 Broadway Street, Fresno, CA. The work is being completed with the review and approval of the Fresno County Department of Public Health and the City of Fresno. Soil and water samples will be tested to see if gasoline or waste oil leaked from the tanks into the soil or water under the site.

We will make every effort to tell you what is happening at the site. Work is scheduled to begin on August 25, 2014 and will be completed in less than two weeks.

\*USTs are considered abandoned when hazardous substances are no longer stored in them and/or monitoring requirements are not being met, including maintenance of the UST system. USTs that are out-of-service for more than 12 months must be removed or permanently closed in place.

## We Apologize For Any Inconvenience...

Trucks and equipment will be in use from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Mondays through Fridays. We will do our best to minimize any inconvenience caused by trucks coming and going from the site.

The area where we are working will be completely fenced off to keep it safe. Once we are done, the site will be returned to its original condition.

## Your Safety Is Important To Us...

- We will clearly mark the work area.
- Activities will be conducted onsite and safety workers will be present during all working hours.
- The dirt taken from the ground will be properly stored and tested for contamination.
- We will make efforts to suppress any dust and/or odors.
- If petroleum contamination is discovered, proper procedures will be followed and local government agencies will be notified.

Site assessment activities, including underground storage tank (UST) removal, are scheduled to begin on August 25, 2014.
