The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has reviewed the above referenced document. Our review and comments are provided pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the Council on Environmental Quality's NEPA Implementation Regulations at 40 CFR 1500-1508, and Section 309 of the Clean Air Act.

The DEIS evaluates alternatives for managing the new California Coastal National Monument, which includes more than 20,000 rocks, small islands, exposed reefs, and pinnacles along the 1,100-mile length of the California coastline. The alternatives evaluated in the DEIS include the No Action, Balanced Management, Resource Protection Emphasis, and Recreation Opportunity Emphasis alternatives.

Under the Proposed Action, the Balanced Management Alternative, environmental resources will be protected while recreation, education, and research opportunities are provided. We support the proposed monitoring and adaptive management, as well as close inter-agency coordination, which are essential elements of your management proposal. We have rated this DEIS as LO -- Lack of Objections (see enclosed "Summary of Rating Definitions").
