The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has reviewed the document referenced above. Our review and comments are provided pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the Council on Environmental Quality's NEPA Implementation Regulations at 40 CFR 1500-1508, and Section 309 of the Clean Air Act.

It appears that the proposed action will provide for more flexible and efficient fire management to reduce hazardous fuels in and around Chiricahua National Monument. The Final EIS provides additional information regarding impacts to water quality and stream and wetland habitat from the proposed action, and commits to several mitigation measures to protect streams and wetlands during controlled burns. We understand that Chiricahua National Monument is a member of the Sonoran Desert Network Inventory and Monitoring Program and will begin long-term monitoring of water quality, quantity, and aquatic ecology parameters this year. Therefore, the Final EIS satisfactorily addresses the concerns we raised in our February 2, 2005, comment letter on the Draft EIS.
