The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has reviewed the above referenced document. Our review and comments are provided pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the Council on Environmental Quality's NEPA Implementation Regulations at 40 CFR 1500-1508, and Section 309 of the Clean Air Act.

In our January 12, 2004, comment letter on the Draft EIS/EIR, we expressed concerns regarding air quality impacts, mitigation measures, and conformity with the applicable State Implementation Plans (SIP). The Final EIS/EIR satisfactorily responds to our concerns by providing updated modeling assumptions and mitigation measures. Based on this updated information, it appears that emissions of criteria pollutants would fall below *de minimis* thresholds and are, therefore, assumed to conform with the SIPs.
