The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has reviewed the above referenced document pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) regulations (40 CFR Parts 1500-1508), and Section 309 of the Clean Air Act.

EPA reviewed the Supplemental Draft Environmental Impact Statement (SDEIS) and provided comments to the U.S. Army on June 15, 2004. We rated the SDEIS as Environmental Concerns - Insufficient Information (EC-2) because of concerns for construction-related air emissions in nonattainment areas for ozone and particulate matter less than 10 microns (PM-10). We also requested the Army's Spill Prevention Plan incorporate procedures for contacting the National Response Center and that the SFEIS identify mitigation measures associated with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife's Biological Opinion for the desert tortoise and the Lane Mountain milk-vetch.

We appreciate the inclusion of quantified construction emissions estimates and mitigation measures to reduce these impacts in the SFEIS. We recommend a commitment to implement these measures be included in the Record of Decision (ROD). The SFEIS also states that the Spill Prevention Plan was modified to include protocols on reporting spills to the National Response Center. Finally, specific mitigation measures are identified in the SFEIS associated with the Biological Opinion for the desert tortoise, and management measures identified for the protection of the Lane Mountain milk-vetch.
