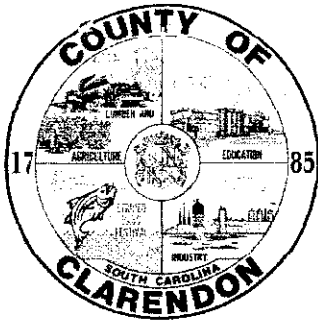

Please find enclosed a copy of the proposed ozone reduction plan for Clarendon County. You will note in its review that the direction of the plan is to demonstrate that a problem with ground level ozone is not believed to exist. This is supported largely by anecdotal evidence but it appears to be accurate for this area. Though a problem is not perceived, the County does not wish to be complacent in the approach to future situations. At this time the plan is still a proposed or preliminary document that is likewise being reviewed by County government. However, the plan is considered a legitimate in the frame of compliance with the Early Action Compact agreements. Please review the document and provide any comments toward its improvement.
