Dear Mr. Rothblatt:

Regarding Illinois' recommendations on 8-hour ozone air quality designations, I am pleased that USEPA accepted our recommended attainment/nonattainment boundaries without modification. I am also pleased to confirm that all of the 2003 ozone season ambient monitoring data collected in Illinois have been quality-assured and have been submitted for incorporation into AIRS. As shown in the attached summary, the quality-assured data for 2003 have not altered Illinois' recommendations for designating attainment and nonattainment areas in Illinois for the 8-hour ozone standard. The data confirm that the Chicago and Metro-East areas are the only portions of Illinois that should be designated as nonattainment for the 8-hour ozone standard.

I appreciate the efforts of you and your staff in this regard and look forward to working with you as the process of finalizing these designations proceeds.
