Nodding Wild Onion



Completely charming, with nodding pink, or white flowers like little fireworks above grey-green narrow leaves. It prefers well-drained soil, and sun or part shade. Beautiful in the front of a perennial border.

Suggested companions: wild geranium (Geranium maculatum), wild lupine (Lupinus perennis), little bluestem (Schizachyrium scoparius). Try it in masses beneath oaks and hickories.
