Canada Anemone



Also called meadow anemone. A lovely species, with large, snow-white, yellow-centered flowers. Give it plenty of room! It spreads like wildfire, and can be hard to control. Beautiful in a meadow, or spreading along the edge of a woodland. Seedheads are attractive spiny globes.

Suggested companions: little bluestem (Schizachyrium scoparius), wild lupine (Lupinus perennis). Works well as a groundcover beneath oaks and hickories.
