Anemone virginiana

Thimbleweed



A tall, slender anemone, with creamy-white flowers and attractive, thimble-shaped seedheads. Give it room to spread at the edge of the woods or in a shady garden bed. Drought tolerant.

Suggested companions: bottlebrush grass (*Hystrix patula*), long-awned wood grass (*Brachyelytrum erectum*), wild geranium (*Geranium maculatum*), beneath oaks and hickories.
