Anemonella thalictroides

Rue Anemone



A lovely, delicate, spring woodland wildflower, with white, or sometimes pink, flowers rising above beautiful, pale green leaves. Long-lived and quite easy to grow. Lovely under deciduous trees such as oaks and hickories. This plant dies back by June, making room in the garden for summer flowering plants.

Suggested companions: round-lobed hepatica (*Hepatica americana*) or sharp-lobed hepatica (*Hepatica acutiloba*), spring beauty (*Claytonia virginica*), Pennsylvania sedge (*Carex pensylvanica*), mayapple (*Podophyllum peltatum*). Lovely under deciduous trees such as oaks and hickories.
