# Aster laevis

## Smooth Aster



Large, sky blue to violet flowers. Foliage is blue-green. Typical of open fields, or the margins of upland forests; abundant in Oakland county. Provide good air circulation to prevent downy mildew. Also known as *Aster oolentangiensis*.

**Suggested companions:** stiff goldenrod (*Solidago rigida*), showy goldenrod (*Solidago speciosa*), little bluestem (*Schizachyrium scoparius*), big bluestem (*Andropogon gerardii*), Indian grass (*Sorghastrum nutans*)
