Sunny yellow flowers with a brown central disk. Can reach 9' , but more often is shorter. Tolerates wet or dry, but requires lots of sun.

Suggested companions: big bluestem (*Andropogon gerardii*), switch grass (*Panicum virgatum*), New England aster (*Aster novae-angliae*), blazing star (*Liatris spicata*), blue vervain (*Verbena hastata*), ironweed (*Vernonia missurica*)
