## Toothed Wood Fern



The plant grows in a well-defined crown. It is sub-evergreen in much of its range, completely deciduous in the northern part, and may be fully evergreen in mild winters towards the south. The toothed wood fern is a good fern for the garden, and is easily grown in ordinary garden soil with constant moisture

Suggested Companions: Elderberry (Sambucus canadensis), joe pye weed (Eupatorium maculatum), boneset (Eupatorium perfoliatum), southern blue flag (Iris virginica), cardinal flower (Lobelia cardinalis), great blue lobelia (lobelia siphilitica), sedges (Carex sp.)
