A highly ornamental native plant, typically found in moist soils. Grows tall with a large lacy flat-topped flower. The large compound leaves are also visually striking. The seed heads are attactive and continue this plant's strong statement through summer and into fall.

Suggested Companions: moonseed (Menispermum canadense), Joe Pye weed (Eupatorium maculatium), ironweed (Vernonia missurica), bottlebrush grass (Elymus hystrix)
