Blazing Star



Also called marsh blazing star, dense blazing star, gay feather. Spectacular spikes of rosy-purple flowers, loved by butterflies. Native to wet meadows, but will grow in drier soil as well.

Suggested companions: swamp milkweed (*Asclepias incarnata*), white turtlehead (*Chelone glabra*), swamp goldenrod (*Solidago patula*), fowl manna grass (*Glyceria striata*), Virginia wild rye (*Elymus virginicus*).
