Also called gray-headed coneflower. Flower heads have a central brown cone surrounded by drooping yellow rays. Non-stop blooming during the heat of summer. Does well in heavy clay.

Suggested companions: big bluestem (Andropogon gerardii), Indian grass (Sorghastrum nutans), tall sunflower (Helianthus giganteus), wild bergamot (Mondarda fistulosa), asters (Aster sp.)
