Rudbeckia fulgida

Eastern Coneflower



Flowers are large, one to a stem, deep yellow-gold, shading to orange at the base of the rays, with purple-brown cones. Seedheads are attractive all winter. Tolerant of a great variety of sites. Tends to be short-lived, even biennial, but self-seeds reliably.

Also called orange coneflower, showy coneflower.

Suggested companions: Joe-Pye weed (Eupatorium maculatum), blue vervain (Verbena hastata), sensitive fern (Onoclea sensibilis), New England aster (Aster novae-angliae)
