A tall striking plant for the summer garden, it's yellow flowers are eye-catching. Normally found in damp areas, it prefers light shade and moist soil.

Suggested Companions: blue lobelia (*Lobelia siphilitica*), cardinal flower (*Lobelia cardinalis*), boneset (*Eupatorium maculatum*), silky dogwood (*Cornus amomum*)
