## Sandbar Willow



Very narrow silver leaves. Yellow catkins appear in late spring after leaves emerge. Important as a protector of stream banks and sandbars; spreads to form dense thickets. Easily transplanted and fast-growing.

Suggested companions: buttonbush (Cephalanthus occidentalis), red-osier dogwood (Cornus stolonifera), silky dogwood (Cornus amomum), skunk cabbage (Symplocarpus foetidus), nannyberry (Viburnum lentago)
