Canada Goldenrod



Flowers in a broad, pyramidal panicle. Adaptable as to site - old fields, roadsides, wet meadows, forest margins. Goldenrods do not cause hayfever! They bloom at the same time as ragweed, a major offender.

Suggested companions: switch grass (Panicum virgatum), Joe Pye weed (Eupatorium maculatum), smooth aster (Aster laevis), blue vervain (Verbena hastata), New England aster (Aster novae-angliae)
