# *Solidago ohioensis*

## Ohio Goldenrod



Flowers in flat-topped clusters. One of the first goldenrods to bloom. Prefers moist sites. Goldenrods do not cause hayfever! They bloom at the same time as ragweed, a major offender.

***Suggested companions:*** meadowsweet (*Spiraea alba*), blue vervain (*Verbena hastata*), fowl manna grass (*Glyceria striata*), Virginia wild rye (*Elymus virginicus*), blazing star (*Liatris spicata*)
