One of the loveliest spring wildflowers. Trilliums thrive in a moist, well-drained soil, and benefit from a mulch of shredded or rotted leaves applied at the beginning and end of the growing season.

Suggested companions: lady-fern (*Athyrium filix-femina*), wild geranium (*Geranium maculatum*), woolly blue violet (*Viola sororia*)
