RE: Request for TSCA PCB Storage Approval

Dear Mr. Kaplan:

The attached is a revised permit application prepared by Solomon Corporation, a transformer repair and reclamation company headquartered in Solomon, Kansas. The included revisions have been made at the request of Lisa Graczyk, EPA Region 5. We request approval for a PCB Commercial Storage Permit for our facility at 1961 Vena Court, Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin, 53821. The facility is appropriately constructed for the described activities and in accordance with all applicable regulations.

The permit would allow Solomon Corporation to receive equipment and waste that is either known or assumed PCB, or equipment whose PCB content is unknown at receipt. Solomon Corporation would test and store equipment for disposal at an authorized disposal facility as detailed in the permit application. The operational plan of the facility does not include disposal of equipment or waste with PCB concentrations greater than or equal to 50 parts per million.

The facility will be operated in accordance with permit terms as established by the Region V office of the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Solomon Corporation will continue to make every effort to ensure the operation of the facility will pose no threat to public health or the environment.
