EPA will issue a Corrective Measures Decision at the General Latex Chemical Company facility in Ashland, Ohio

Public Comment Period: August 22, -Oct.07, 2013

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has overseen Corrective Action activities at the General Latex Chemical Company facility; a wholly owned subsidiary of the Dow Chemical Company. The Statement of Basis explains the proposed remedy for addressing any contaminated soil, surface water, sediment, or groundwater at the facility. The Statement of Basis also explains the rationale for selecting the remedy and summarizes any other remedies evaluated. EPA will select a final remedy for the facility after a 45-day public comment period has ended and any additional information that was received has been reviewed and considered.

More detailed corrective action information and reports; and other site related documents contained in the administrative record for this facility are available for review at these two locations:

EPA has scheduled a 45 day **public comment period** starting **Aug. 22, 2013** ending at midnight **Oct. 07**. To receive comments on the proposed actions, during this public comment period, EPA will accept written comments on the proposed determination and if requested will evaluate a public meeting.
