TO: Hazardous Waste Industry Community

I am writing to invite your organization's participation in the development of a national hazardous waste electronic manifest (e-Manifest) system. On October 5, 2012, President Obama signed into law the "Hazardous Waste Electronic Manifest Establishment Act" which authorizes the U. S. EPA to implement a national electronic manifest system. Commonly referred to as "e-Manifest", this national system is envisioned to be implemented by the EPA in partnership with industry and states. As you know, the e-Manifest system will be an alternative to the paper-based manifest system currently in use.

The U.S. EPA Office of Resource Conservation and Recovery is beginning a process to obtain e-Manifest system requirements from the users of the hazardous waste manifest program, including States and the regulated community. The U.S. EPA will be conducting a series of three face-to-face requirements gathering meetings, and invites your organization's participation. State users are also being invited.

The purpose of the face-to-face meetings will be to collect up-to-date requirements for e-Manifest's functionality and operations. Each meeting will be a day and a half. For travel planning purposes, note that for each meeting, the first day will last from 9 am to 5 pm and the second day will last from 9 am to 1 pm. Each meeting will be similar in agenda, providing multiple opportunities for your participation and thus it is only necessary for participants to attend one of the three meetings. Attendees to these requirements gathering meetings should include technical staff that manage or work directly with manifest data and processes as well as staff that have specialized understanding of the manifest program and business process. This may include for example, technical and IT staff that manage shipment and manifest tracking capabilities, or practitioners who regularly engage in the manifest process. Other potentially interested parties may include but are not limited to: IT staff personnel supporting hazardous waste generators, hazardous waste treatment, storage and disposal facilities (TSDFs), and hazardous waste transporters for their respective companies; non-governmental organizations; and trade associations dealing with hazardous waste transportation issues. People with specific technical expertise, such as computer system specialists, information officers, IT managers and others are encouraged to attend.

High level topic areas for which requirements will be discussed at the meetings include but are not limited to:

- e-Manifest workflow, including mobile field component and handler submission;
- e-Manifest business rule processing;
- Electronic signature (e-signature) and CROMERR conformance;
- Paper manifest processing;
- Data access and reporting;
- State data consumption and interaction;
- Data QA; and
- User administration and security

The exact format and agenda for the meetings is still being determined, however, all up to date information, including meeting logistics will be available on our website:
