SUBJECT: Guidance for Using the New Streamlined Authorization Procedures for the Approval of Previously Promulgated Rulemakings

The purpose of this memorandum is to reiterate the high priority OSW places on RCRA Subtitle C State authorization by providing guidance that will enhance the use of the streamlined authorization procedure promulgated in the HWIR-media final rule (November 30, 1998, 63 FR 65874). I consider the promulgation and implementation of this new procedure to be a major component of our efforts to speed the authorization of States for the RCRA program.

This new procedure simplifies State authorization applications for minor or routine rules by not requiring a revision to a State's Attorney General's statement, Program Description, and Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with EPA. The procedure also shortens the authorization process by setting a deadline of 60 days from receipt of a complete application for EPA to publish a Federal Register notice on its authorization decision. This new procedure can be used for rules that are listed in Table 1 to 40 CFR 271.21. We will continue to add new rules to this table as they are published.

As discussed in the preamble to the HWIR-media rule, the existing authorization regulations provide EPA with the flexibility to determine what specific documents must be included in a State's authorization application (see 40 CFR 271.21(b)). EPA also has the programmatic discretion to commit to specific time frames for the review of a State's application, depending on factors such as the scope and significance of the rules addressed in that application. In the HWIR-media preamble, EPA made a commitment to develop guidance which would implement the flexibility in the existing regulations to expedite the authorization of previously promulgated minor or routine rulemakings by following the provisions of the new streamlined procedures.

The attached table lists previously promulgated rulemakings that EPA considers to be routine or minor in nature. In developing this table, EPA took into account the criteria EPA will use to propose to list a new rule in Table 1 of 271.21, the considerations discussed in the preamble regarding the basis and rationale for the new procedures, and EPA's experience in authorizing States for these existing rules. EPA and States may use the timetables and application requirements in the new streamlined authorization process for the rules listed in the table.

OSW is aware that there are additional rulemakings that could be considered to be minor or routine but are not listed in the attached table. For example, rulemakings promulgated before July 1, 1990 are not listed in the table. Many of these rulemakings may meet the criteria for being minor or routine. However, we did not include these rulemakings because most States are already authorized for these rules, and the remaining States are developing large applications that would be inefficient to divide into two separate applications. If there is a specific circumstance where a State wants to pursue streamlined authorization for these earlier rules, the State can ask EPA if these procedures are appropriate.

Also missing from the table are technical corrections to significant rules that have been incorporated into the authorization checklists for the underlying rules. Although these technical corrections would likely be considered as minor or routine on their own, they are not included in the table because States generally receive authorization for them at the same time as the underlying rule. However, if a State received authorization for only the significant rule and not the technical correction, the new streamlined procedures may be used for the corrections.

Note that this guidance does not affect EPA's ability under 40 CFR 271.21(d) to request a supplemental Attorney General's statement, program description, or other documents or information as necessary. However, we expect this will rarely be necessary given the types of regulatory provisions identified in this guidance.
