**Summary:** Revision Checklist 101 has been withdrawn. On February 18, 1992, EPA issued an administrative stay of the requirements for drip pad coatings, sealers, or covers for existing drip pads at wood preserving plants. The effect of the stay was to extend the effective date of coating, sealer, or cover requirements for existing drip pads until October 30, 1992. The administrative stay has since expired. Revision Checklist 120 (December 24, 1992; 57 FR 61492) removed the note containing the administrative stay. As a result, States seeking authorization for the wood preserving listings should not adopt the Revision Checklist 101 changes.

**Attorney General's Statement Entry**: Subsection XV N should be replaced by the following revised paragraph:

## N. [FOR STATES THAT ADOPTED REVISION CHECKLIST 101

ADMINISTRATIVE STAY] State statutes and regulations no longer contain the withdrawn Revision Checklist 101 administrative stay for the requirement that existing drip pads be impermeable, as indicated in Revision Checklist 120.
