CMAQ Background

- Authorized by ISTEA in 1991
- Title 23 Section 149: The CMAQ program is established for transportation projects that contribute to the attainment or maintenance of the national ambient air quality standards for ozone, carbon monoxide, or particulate matter.
- More than \$29 billion invested in 28,000 projects since 1992

CMAQ Background (cont'd)

- Applicant should be a public body
 - Public/Private partnerships are permitted
 - Familiarity with administering FHWA funds is desirable
- Funds are to be used in nonattainment and maintenance areas for ozone, CO and PM
 - Includes 1-hour ozone maintenance areas
 - If no nonattainment areas, anywhere in the state
- Programming may be at state or MPO level

CMAQ Background (cont'd)

- Wide range of eligible projects
 - transit improvements
 - traffic flow improvements
 - bicycle and pedestrian projects
 - - ...
 - alternative fuels (not required by law)
 - diesel retrofits (verified)
 - anti-idling facilities

Alternate Fuel Specifics

- Vehicle acquisitions
- Vehicle conversions
- Refueling facilities
- Incremental costs for private vehicles
- Public vehicles At least the increment or emissions reduction
- MO, IA, MN, WI, IL, IN, OH: Purchase of alternative fuels or biodiesel

Freight & Diesel Retrofit

- Diesel retrofits for on-road, and off-road engines used in construction projects in ozone or PM nonattainment or maintenance areas
 - Includes replacement, repowering, rebuilding, after treatment technology.
 - Title 23 projects only
- On-road vehicles
- Locomotives

Freight & Diesel Retrofit (cont'd)

- SmartWay technology
- Intermodal facilities
- Truck stop electrification
- Auxiliary power units
- Heavy-duty scrappage
- Outreach activities for diesel retrofits

Northeastern Illinois Projects

- 40 projects since 2005
- \$118 million in federal funds programmed
- Retrofits School buses, locomotives, buses, municipal fleets
- Hybrid buses
- Alternative fuels
- Truck stop electrification
- Innovative technologies

Northeastern Illinois Experience

- These kinds of projects are unfamiliar to the state DOT
- They can also be unfamiliar to the sponsor
- Innovative technology projects can run into barriers
- Soft match may prove difficult to use
- The state may be a better sponsor than a local agency
- "Umbrella" projects can be very practical
- Railroads have lawyers, too



Reauthorization

- SAFETEA-LU expired in 2009
- MAP-21 is Senate reauthorization proposal
- CMAQ is still alive
- Don't drive yourself crazy, unless you want to
