#### The Road to Clean Diesel

- 1995: Illinois General Assembly established the Diesel Emissions Task Force to develop policy recommendations on reducing diesel emissions (initiated by the American Lung Association of Metropolitan Chicago)
- 2005: Illinois EPA & Delta Institute convene the Illinois Environmental Policy Dialogue that focused on transportation issues and reducing emissions, especially from diesel vehicles
- 2006: Illinois EPA establishes the Mobile Source SIP Subcommittee as a subset of the Illinois Environmental Policy Dialogue to make recommendations on reducing diesel emissions
- 2006-2007: Lake Michigan Air Director's Consortium (LADCO) issued a comprehensive study that analyzes the contribution to air pollution by diesel vehicles and various options for emission reductions
- 2007: Respiratory Health Association and its advocacy partners started the Illinois Campaign to Clean Up Diesel Pollution
- 2007: Illinois EPA and partners reconvened as the Illinois Clean Diesel Workgroup
- 2008-2010: Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) provides \$
  Millions in CMAQ funding for clean diesel projects in working with many local governments

- Are conservative as only the projects for which we have specific data and information are included
- Do not include truck stop electrification sites
- Do not reflect estimated numbers resulting from idling laws, ordinances, or voluntary anti-idling efforts
- Only include known alternate fuel vehicles that would otherwise operate with diesel
- Do not include trucks operating on B11 or lower biodiesel blends, only B20 or higher included

#### IEPA Current & Near-Term Funding

50% match being requested from applicants due to federal match requirement for state's "bonus" funding

Engine repowers, APUs, and DFHs expected to represent the types of projects resulting from 2009 and 2010 State Allocation funds

### Other Upcoming Projects

Chicago Area Clean Cities (through the City of Chicago Dept. of Environment) received \$15 Million in stimulus funding for alternate fuel infrastructure for the metro area

Several alternate fuel heavy-duty vehicles will emerge from this project

### Illinois Clean Diesel Workgroup

- IEPA received majority of its applications through the communications and outreach of the ICDW
- IEPA was able to select/fund most applications
- IEPA is accepting applications for 2009 and 2010 DERA State Allocation funding
