Dear Administrator Johnson:

On behalf of the Local Government Advisory Committee, we strongly believe in EPA's efforts to consult with local governments on a continuing basis as part of EPA's normal collaborative processes. From our discussions with you last year, we know that you are committed to working with local elected officials because of the critical role we play in providing environmental services.

We want to bring to your attention the need for an institutional mechanism to acquire full local government cooperation to make the implementation of the "Great Lakes Regional Collaboration Strategy" a robust effort. In particular, because the vast majority of land adjacent to the Lakes resides within the jurisdiction of small communities, this institutional mechanism needs to have numerous elected officials from such communities. Furthermore, these units of local government will be critical to the success of the Strategy, and thereby to the success of saving the Great Lakes.

The key advantages of this recommended mechanism are: (1) implementation proposals and cost-estimates will receive practical ground-truthing prior to roll-out to the public; (2) real local case-study examples will be made available in a timely manner; and (3) communication with local elected officials of draft and final policies and cost-estimates will be better executed. On this latter advantage, we strongly believe that local officials are the best advocates for policies affecting local governments and thereby early involvement will lead to sustained support.
