#### **II** Narrative Discussion

The 3rd quarter of 2008 consisted of very little activity. As in the previous quarter a significant amount of time has been spent on testing the software that is being developed by our contractor (enfoTech). We are hoping that major issues will be resolved in the coming months and a final version will be available in the fall.

Three inspectors from the MDEQ, Air Quality Division's Dry Cleaning program began conducting post certification inspections on 250 randomly selected facilities in June and they are expected to continue until October. Data is being gathered on hard-copy forms. Inspectors have been instructed to submit them to me as they complete a batch. We are developing a database to input the data. Unfortunately collection of this data is taking a little longer than anticipated due to the large number of facilitites in the sample and limited number of inspectors. We hope to have all post certification inspections completed by October 31. A copy of the inspector form that is being used to collect the follow up data was submitted with the previous quarterly report.

III Projection of Activities, Accomplishments, and Major expenditures for Next Quarter Report Post certification inspections are expected to end on October 31. Testing of Software system will continue into next quarter. We also expect to be able to take the field module of the software into the field for some final testing in November.
