Summary Description

To develop and implement a voluntary program designed to encourage positive environmental actions that potentially will include reduced air, land, and water emissions and discharges by Indiana businesses and industry. The goal of the Environmental Stewardship Program (ESP) program is to encourage beyond compliance activities to decrease industry's negative impact on the environment. This program will create new partnerships between the State, local industry, and business, and will require implementation of an Environmental Management System (EMS) to promote beyond compliance environmental initiatives.

Under this Cooperative Agreement, IDEM will develop and implement ESP. Upon acceptance to ESP, each facility will begin to implement one of three pre-determined environmental improvement initiatives as defined in their application. IDEM will publicly recognize those facilities that are accepted into ESP. In addition, IDEM will track the environmental benefits achieved by participating municipalities and provide regulatory incentives where practicable.

IDEM continues to make progress and achieve the milestones identified in the 2006 State Innovations Grant Program project narrative.

Summer/Fall 2006

Milestone: Implementation: Responding to requests for assistance; amount and type of

assistance provided; providing on-site assistance to facilities, offering EMS training programs to facilities; accepting applications to join the program; brochures printed and distributed; booth available for use; advertising the program at various conferences and workshops; EMS/P2OA Assistance contractor selected. Conduct site visits at applicants with approved EMS's

and conduct site visit and EMS assessment at other applicants.

IDEM continues to provide EMS training programs and assistance to Indiana entities through a series of workshops throughout the state. These workshops are being funded through IDEM and are not part of this grant. The intent of the workshops is to increase the number of Indiana facilities implementing EMSs and, as a result, increase the number of ESP applications. One workshop was held this quarter. There are four workshops scheduled to occur during the next quarter.

Additionally, IDEM finalized a contract for EMS onsite assistance. IDEM met with the hired contractor to discuss the marketing strategy and details of the EMS assistance. The contractor is expected to provide IDEM with a copy of the marketing plan for approval during the next quarter. The goal of the contract is to provide onsite EMS assistance to twenty Indiana entities by July 2009.

Winter 2007 – Summer 2009

Milestone:

Implementation and Modifications: Reviewing applications and announcing facilities meeting the program requirements; continue assisting potential applicants and promoting the program; speaking at meetings, workshops, and conferences to promote the program; begin offering incentives to successful applicants and tracking outcomes; modify the program as necessary; continue identifying potential incentives; quantify success stories through monetary and environmental benefits; continue working with EPA NCEI to identify and implement additional incentives to state and federal environmental leadership programs.

Status: ON-GOING

IDEM continues to respond to phone and email inquiries requesting assistance with the program application and identifying pollution prevention opportunities. IDEM also continues to respond to inquiries concerning ESP program requirements, regulatory incentives, and application procedures.

IDEM received five applications during the spring 2008 application round. During this quarter, IDEM reviewed the applications and conducted site visits at each facility. All five applicants were announced as new members of the Environmental Stewardship Program in August 2008. There are currently 38 members of ESP.

During this same time period, IDEM continued marketing the Environmental Stewardship Program in anticipation of the fall 2008 application round. The ESP Program Manager spent 15 hours marketing ESP in June, 35 hours in July, and 10 hours in August.

IDEM advertised ESP at various events and newsletters during this quarter. ESP was presented during the CLEAN / ESP Seminar on August 20th as well as the Indiana Chamber of Commerce *GreeNotes* listserv on August 28th. IDEM plans to have an entire afternoon session devoted to ESP during the Indiana Partners for Pollution Prevention Conference on September 17, 2008.

The rules affording ESP members with regulatory incentives became effective during the fourth quarter. IDEM continues to process incentives requests from fall 2007 members as well as spring 2008 members. The ESP program manager has found incentive implementation to be difficult and time consuming. Thus the ESP program manager is scheduling a lean / continuous improvement event with each IDEM program office to map the incentive implementation and tracking process. Each event is being scheduled for January 2009.

During previous quarters, the ESP program manager discussed the creation of an "ESP Corporate Membership" with several ESP members as well as with EPA and other interested states. The ESP program manager continues to develop Corporate Member criteria and will seek comments from ESP members.

IDEM continues to work with EPA Region 5 and Headquarters to sign a Memorandum of Agreement for implementation of federal regulatory incentives for program members. During this quarter, the ESP program manager revised the MOA language and sent it to EPA Region 5 for review. Upon further discussion with Region 5, the ESP program manager determined that an approval tracking document was needed for each The ESP program manager sent EPA Region 5 the list of regulatory incentives requesting approval and comments on each incentive. EPA responded listing incentive approvals, denials, and comments, as well as the individuals at EPA Region 5 responsible for approving or denying each incentive. The ESP program manager created a spreadsheet to track each incentive. Additionally, the ESP program manager compared Indiana's incentives with all other state-Performance Track program incentives and identified several new incentives to add. The ESP program manager will begin working on implementing these new incentives during the next quarter. In the meantime, the ESP program manager continues to work with Dan Murray, Assistant Commissioner of Office of Air Quality, and Commissioner Thomas Easterly in an effort to remove the "monthly compliance methods for VOCs" from the MOA to stimulate the signature process.

During the eighth quarter, IDEM Commissioner Tom Easterly and Assistant Commissioner Rick Bossingham conducted five ESP recognition ceremonies (August 6, 7, two on 20, and 28) and issued five press releases for Round 3 members. ESP program manager scheduled the remaining Round 3 ceremonies for the next quarter. Round 4 ceremonies will be scheduled following the completion of Round 3 ceremonies. Additionally,

the ESP program manager worked with Assistant Commissioner Rick Bossingham and Commissioner Thomas Easterly this quarter to develop an Event Planner Template for ESP ceremonies. The ESP program manager has scheduled a leaning / continuous improvement event for next quarter to improve the ESP ceremony scheduling process.

Summer/Fall 2009

Milestone: Implementation and Documentation: Continue program as described

above; measure results and outcomes of program and begin development of final report; begin consideration of future of program. Complete and submit final report to EPA; Innovations Grant completed; determine future of program including funding and office responsible for management.

Project Timetable

In addition to the on-going milestones, the project timetable and activities to be completed during the next quarter are listed below:

- Finish quantifying ESP and PT annual performance reports and post achievements on the ESP website.
- Review and process applications from the fifth ESP application round including compliance checks, review of applicant's EMS materials, and scheduling of site visits.
- ESP program managers will work with EPA to update the PT Annual Performance Report to
 include a section for dual Indiana PT / ESP members to submit the next ESP commitment.
 Otherwise, Indiana PT / ESP members must submit the annual performance report to EPA
 using PTrack and then email the ESP program managers which of the PT commitments will
 be used for ESP membership that calendar year.
- Assist members of program with incentives including modifications to permits to allow them to benefit from incentives.
- Speak at meetings, conferences, and workshops promoting the program.
- Manage a contract for onsite EMS development assistance.
- Provide EMS assistance to facilities wishing to pursue ESP membership.
- Submit quarterly report to EPA on various measures.

Project Funding

The project funding status can be found in the attached Federal Financial Report (Grant Balance tab). The report provides the project expenses year to date. According to the report, IDEM has incurred \$127,931.11 through July 31, 2008. Further, the report shows that IDEM has approximately \$403,494.89 grant funding remaining (approximately \$232,655.15 state and \$170,839.74 federal), which is sufficient to perform the expected program duties throughout the life of the grant. IDEM anticipates fully utilizing the entire grant award for ESP implementation and delivering technical assistance regarding environmental management systems to Indiana regulated entities.
