Project Overview

This project is intended to broaden the range of business sectors involved in Arizona's newly formed Performance Track Program through both existing and new initiatives designed specifically for small business, small communities and agricultural enterprises. Arizona proposes to develop guidance and templates for Small Community Environmental Protection Plans (very similar to EMS's) under a new ADEQ policy that is based on EPA's recently modified Small Community Policy. The project will also create an agricultural performance track. Arizona will partner with air quality departments of Maricopa, Pima, and Pinal Counties who have EPA delegation to implement Title V of the Clean Air Act. The project proposes to significantly reduce one of the burdens of applying for membership in Arizona's program and PT by developing comprehensive EMS guidance and templates (meeting standards set by Performance Track) with plans to make them generally available to the regulated community. The project also proposes to further develop incentives which streamline the permitting process and reduce reporting obligations.

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Section 1 – Summary of Activities

ADEQ's Four EMS Templates are now posted on the ADEQ website. ADEQ staff has scheduled EMS workshops to assist the regulated community in developing an EMS using the new ADEQ templates. A Guide for Developing and Implementing a Small Community Environmental Protection Plan (SCEPP) is completed. ADEQ's Community Liaisons have taken the lead in working directly with small Arizona communities and special taxing districts to encourage them to develop a SCEPP under our Small Community Policy. A draft PowerPoint presentation on Arizona's Small Community Policy has been developed and is awaiting management approval and will be used by our Community Liaisons in their outreach program. The draft SCEPP template is nearing completion and should be ready for management review in the second quarter of 2008. ADEQ's Ptrack website has been revised to include links to the EMS templates, EMS workshops schedule and Small Community SCEPP guidance. We are working with our Air Quality Permits Section Manager on developing flexible air permits as an incentive. We are working with our Ptrack partners in developing an annual member, partnership and agency staff survey followed by an annual conference with Performance Track members and collaborative partnership agencies and trade associations to evaluate the effectiveness of the program and discuss future incentives designed to benefit existing and future members and to encourage mentoring programs.

Accomplishments:

Two complex guidance documents were completed and posted to our ADEQ website: <u>Four EMS Templates</u> and <u>A Guide for Developing and Implementing a Small Community Environmental Protection Plan (SCEPP)</u>.

ADEQ has approved three (3) new AZ Ptrack members: Freescale Semiconductor, Inc., Chandler; Freescale Semiconductor, Inc., Tempe; and Morman Lake Lodge.

ADEQ gave a presentation on Performance Track at a RCRA seminar at Arizona State University and met with Brown & Cardwell Consulting firm to discuss their own membership in the Performance Track program as well as clients they represent.

ADEQ continues to participate in EPA monthly State Conference Calls and teleseminars and continues to work with EPA to review new member applications, annual reports and renewal applications.

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Problems:

ADEQ is awaiting receipt of the signed MOA by EPA so we can contact and meet with other county and state agency representatives to discuss Performance Track, permit flexibility, reduced reporting incentives, and to develop additional requirements needed to receive multi-agency incentives. Additionally, we are awaiting EPA notice of accreditation of their Ptrack Site Visit training and subsequent release of the next training dates and locations.

- Further develop the existing EMS guidance and templates.
- ADEQ will make guidance and templates available on ADEQ's web page devoted to Performance Track.
- Increase membership in Arizona Performance
- Measure quantified pollution reductions of members.

Agriculture Performance Track

- Invite appropriate members of the agricultural community, along with other state and federal agencies (e.g., Arizona Department of Agriculture and EPA), to participate in an open dialogue about the existing Performance Track program and whether it is applicable to agricultural operations in Arizona.
- Discuss with the group what modifications to the program might increase the likelihood of participation
- Explore a new program better suited to agricultural operations while still meeting the spirit and intent of Performance Track.
- Program description will be available on ADEQ's web page.
- ADEQ will track the number of participants along with the quantifiable environmental improvement projects of its members.

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<u>Improvements to Permitting Flexibility and Reduced Reporting Incentives</u>

- ADEQ will contact other state agencies which regulate facilities eligible for performance track (e.g., Arizona Department of Water Resources).
- ADEQ will meet with these agencies to discuss the benefits and goals of Environmental Performance Track and explore permit flexibility or reporting incentives that might be offered by the other State agencies.
- Develop additional requirements needed to receive the benefits.
- Incentives will be posted on ADEQ's web page and included in Arizona's Performance Track application and associated literature.
- Development of external guidance on the permit flexibility and reduced reporting incentives
- Engage the assistance of the group which helped ADEQ in the development of the Arizona program.
- Improve the permitting flexibility and reporting reduced reporting incentives
- Asking applicants why they applied, and whether the new guidance on these incentives played a role in their decision.
- Measure results of the quantified environmental improvement project as a success of the incentive improvements.

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
