Dear Chairman St. Germaine:

Thank you for your March 19, 2003, letter submitting your Tribe's recommendation on the air quality designations for the 8-hour national health-based standard for ground-level ozone. We reviewed your recommendation and, consistent with Section 107(d)(1) of the Clean Air Act (CAA), by this letter inform you that the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) does not intend to modify your recommendation. We intend to designate Iron, Oneida, and Vilas Counties in Wisconsin, and all Indian country land therein, as attainment/unclassifiable.

The EPA is obligated by the CAA to designate the air quality for all areas of the United States, including Indian country. It is EPA's responsibility under Section 107(d)(1) to determine if the population within a given area is exposed to unhealthy levels of specific air pollutants, in this case ground-level ozone. We implement this responsibility by identifying the areas that experience the unhealthy air and any nearby areas that are contributing to the air quality problem. The enclosure to this letter provides a table in which we identify the areas in Wisconsin that EPA is intending to designate as nonattainment.

The EPA has also been tracking 2003 ozone monitoring data and their potential impact on your areas' designations. If the data should support a change to the recommended designations, EPA will coordinate closely with you to determine the appropriate course of action.

We look forward to continued discussions with your Tribe as we work to finalize the designations for the 8-hour ozone standard. We appreciate your efforts in recommending the designation status of your lands and will review any future supporting information

you wish to submit on these recommendations until February 6, 2004, so that we can move forward to make final designations by April 15, 2004.
