Dear Bharat Mathur,

I am writing to you concerning the 8-hour ozone air quality designation of the St. Croix tribal lands.

I understand that tribes are not required to make designations and that if designations are not made, USEPA, in consultation with the Tribe, will promulgate the designation it doesns appropriate on behalf of the Tribe, as it would for states. I understand that EPA data suggests an attainment designation for St. Croix. I also understand that, under the Clean Air Act and the Tribal Authority Rule, St. Croix Tribe could in the future produce a Tribal Implementation Plan to develop and enforce ozone standards more stringent than the NAAQS.

The St. Croix Tribe will accept designation as an attainment area. However, I would like to voice the widely held objection to the treatment of tribes in a manner similar to states. Tribes are sovereign nations. The promulgation of standards by the USEPA in Indian country is an affront to this sovereignty.
