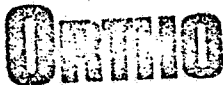

Dear Mr. Smith:

This is in further reference to your letter of December 16 agreeing to hold petitions PP 5G1604 and FAP 5H5081 in abeyance until the end of January, 1976 to permit completion of analysis of residue samples.

We are submitting herewith five copies of the following documents to amend these petitions:

1. Amendment to Section B

Section B is amended by submitting the additional efficacy and phytotoxicity data accumulated during the conduct of 1975 trials under Permit 239-EXP-71G. These trials confirm the good results reported in PP 5G1604 and show that 1 lb. active per acre is the maximum amount of ORTHENE 75 S needed. The proposed label for the temporary permit extension for the 1976 test season has not been changed from the label included in the Section B of the petitions when originally submitted.

2. Amendment to Section D

We conducted an extensive series of residue tests in 1975 under Permit 239-EXP-71G and have included these data in this amendment. The information in the amendment fulfills the request in Par. 1 of your letter of July 22, 1975 for more data for domestic grapes, raisins, raisin waste, wine and pomace.

3. Amendment to Section F

We have amended Section F, requesting a temporary tolerance of 5 ppm for grapes and temporary food additive tolerances of 12 ppm for raisins, 6 ppm for raisin waste and 10 ppm for pomace. Data in Section D support these tolerance levels.

A certified check in the amount of \$2,000.00 is enclosed, payable to the Environmental Protection Agency, to cover the petition amendment fee.

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
