# Pesticide Worker Safety Program Improvements Agricultural Worker Protection Regulation

### **BACKGROUND:**

The agricultural worker protection regulation (40 CFR 170) establishes requirements for agricultural employers to provide protections for workers laboring in pesticide-treated fields, and for pesticide handlers who mix, load, and apply those pesticides. The regulation was expanded significantly in 1992. EPA is considering a range of changes to the agricultural worker protection regulation.

### **REGULATION REVISION:**

After a program assessment and broad stakeholder engagement, a project was launched to amend the regulation to close gaps in protection, address deficiencies, and apply lessons learned since the rule was issued. The changes under consideration are intended to:

- improve protections to human health,
- strengthen the ability to enforce the regulation, and
- improve program operational efficiency and administration, and rule clarity.

#### **KEY GOALS:**

- 1. Better trained workers by improving training content and quality, and addressing current regulatory gaps that allow employers to avoid training workers:
  - Reduce retraining interval
  - Expand training contents
  - Eliminate grace period
  - Improve worker trainer competency
  - Require training recordkeeping
- 2. Better protections for workers during restricted entry intervals (REIs):
  - Ag employer required to provide notifications to workers when directing early entry (during REI) to a treated area
  - Post warning signs at treated area for pesticide applications with extended REIs
  - Improve content of warning signs for posting at treated areas during REI.
- 3. Improve protections for workers during pesticide applications:
  - Reduce potential for worker exposure through drift by extending the requirements for entry restricted areas around applications to farms and forests, similar to those in place for nurseries and greenhouses.
- 4. Improve hazard communication protections:
  - Expand information on application and hazard required to be made available
  - Specify when application information must be recorded and retention period
    - Require handler employer to notify agricultural employer of any changes in application, within specified time period
- 5. Improve effectiveness of safety poster and emergency information:
  - Expand poster content to match expanded training points
  - Add requirement for poster at decontamination supply location
  - Specify emergency information to be provided and timeframe for providing it
