Lead Poisoning Prevention Program 2006 XL Report

1. Number of children screened:
 - 10,995 children were screened during the year.
 - Direct screening by CHD staff included the following:
 - Providing on-going lead screening at no cost twice a month in CHD Walk-in Clinic.
 - Continued commitment with Early Childhood Resource Network (Help Me Grow) to provide lead screens with Child Check for entire City.
 - Provided screens for Child Development Council Head Start Program Centers.
2. Number of children with elevated blood lead levels:
 - 56 were elevated ($PbB \geq 10$ ug/dL) during the year.
3. Number of lead hazard investigations conducted:
 - 67 investigations conducted.
4. Number of lead hazard reductions completed:
 - 74 lead hazard reductions completed
5. Number of professional educational presentations :
 - Participated in six Neighborhood Pride campaigns.
 - Conducted 41 presentations
 - Continued to provide a HEPA vacuum loaner program. This service is encouraged to all participants in the Healthy Homes Program. It is available (free) to all citizens of Columbus and Worthington.
 - In coordination with the Department of Development, ran public service announcements promoting hand washing. Received 516 phone requests for "Wash your Hands" CD.
 - In 2006 we produced a television commercial in conjunction with an area NBC station. The 30 second commercial aired 160 times over a 30 day period. It is estimated that we made 3,790,000 gross impressions during that time. As a result of the commercial we received requests for information from 83 different towns and cities in 6 states.

- 21 were sponsored for training as lead workers, lead abatement contractors and lead abatement contractors refresher courses.
- At their request, we delivered 60 hand washing CD's to the Columbus Development Center Head Start. They manage 21 Head Start / daycare centers. 1200 little people will hear the hand washing song and message.
- Handed out 276 hand washing CD's at a Bike Fest to small kids at Scottwood Elementary.
- We handed out 320 hand washing CD's at a Bike Fest to small kids at Maize Rd. Elementary.
- We provided 239 hand washing CD's to participants at the State of Ohio Lead Conference. They were used as "stocking stuffers" given out at the registration table. We could have provided more had we not run out of CD's.
- 25 hand washing CD's delivered to the WIC (Women Infants and Children) program which has 20 satellite facilities. They provide services to 35,000 children of low income households in Columbus and Franklin County.
- Since we will not be able to verify the outcome, we will assume a rate of 1% on individuals reached. This would be 350 out of 35,000 children. We expect that the hand washing song will reach a lot more than 1% of the children involved with WIC.
- Lead Safe Columbus set up a booth and participated in a 2 day health and fitness expo at the Columbus Convention Center. 417 hand washing CD's were given out along with lead related info.
- We sent 15 hand washing CD's and 1000 bars of soap to an orphanage in Honduras by way of a fellow City employee who went on a mission trip with his church. There are 200 kids at the orphanage.

Elements to be monitored/tracked and reported by the Division of Water:

The Division of Water will monitor in accordance with Section IV.G of this Agreement and report the results to US EPA Region 5 and OEPA within 10 days following the end of each monitoring period, unless there is a lead AL exceedence or lead monitoring results at consumers taps exceed 30 µg/L as a 90th percentile value, in which case the Division will notify OEPA and US EPA Region 5 within 10 days after learning of the exceedence.

The Division fully complied with all monitoring and reporting requirements for the year 2006. There **was not** a lead AL exceedence, nor did lead monitoring results at consumer's taps exceed 30 µg/L as a 90th percentile value.
