**Action:** Notice of Proposed Assessment of Class II Clean Water Act Section 309(g)(2)(B) Administrative Penalties and Opportunity to Comment

Under Section 309(g) of the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. § 1319(g), EPA is authorized to assess a civil penalty after providing the person subject to the penalty with notice of the proposed penalty and the opportunity for a hearing, and after providing interested persons public notice of the proposed penalty and a reasonable opportunity to comment on its issuance. In Class II proceedings under Section 309(g)(2)(B), any person who violates certain provisions of the Clean Water Act may administratively be assessed a civil penalty of up to \$10,000 per violation per day for each day during which the violation continues, up to a maximum of \$125,000. Pursuant to 40 C.F.R. Part 19 (Adjustments of Civil Penalties for Inflation), promulgated pursuant to the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996, 31 U.S.C. § 3701, the maximum civil penalties that may administratively be assessed have been increased as follows: For violations occurring on or after March 15, 2004, up to \$11,000 per violation per day for each day during which the violation continues, up to a maximum of \$157,500. Proceedings are conducted in accordance with the “Consolidated Rules of Practice Governing the

Administrative Assessment of Civil Penalties and the Revocation/Termination or Suspension of Permits,” at 40 C.F.R. Part 22 (“Part 22”).

Part 22 sets forth the procedures by which the public may submit written comments on a proposed penalty order or participate in a penalty proceeding. The deadline for submitting public comment on a proposed penalty order is thirty (30) days after issuance of the public notice.

**Description of Violations Alleged in Complaint:**

Respondent violated provisions of the Clean Water Act. Specifically, Respondent 1) discharged pollutants into navigable waters of the United States without a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (“NPDES”) permit; 2) failed to apply in a timely manner for a NPDES permit; 3) discharged pollutants into navigable waters of the United States in violation of the NPDES General Permit for Storm Water Discharges from Construction Activities by not implementing best management practices and by not documenting periodic inspections; and 4) failed to respond to an EPA Request for Information.

**Proposed Penalty:** Up to \$157,500
