Technical Update

EPA's contractor will be collecting additional data over the next few months, mostly to address sediment stability (modeling study) issues raised by CSTAG. In addition, surface water samples will



be collected later this week from the upstream side of Allendale Dam and Lyman Mill Dam. The surface water samples will be analyzed for dioxins and furans to assess surface water quality during normal flow conditions. Samples will be obtained later in the spring to assess surface water quality during high flow conditions. The data will be used to assess the mass of dioxin moving through the water system.

Other activities to be completed in addressing recommendations made by CSTAG include: (i) the collection of additional sediment sample cores from Lyman Mill Pond to better characterize the contaminant distribution in pond sediments; (ii) additional sediment sampling in the Manton Pond area; and (iii) pore water sampling in the river near monitoring well MW-5 and the Brook Village parking lot to assess risks from the high levels of contamination in this area of the site.

It was noted that in some ways Lyman Mill Pond is more contaminated than Allendale Pond because Lyman Mill Pond is approximately twice the size of Allendale Pond, and therefore has more resources that are at risk.

Jane Sherman mentioned that the Woonasquatucket River Watershed Council is coordinating sampling efforts downstream of Lyman Mill Dam to assess fish passage / dam removal issues.
