

We note that the EPA's Information Request is addressed to Samuel Cabot Construction. We have never used that name, and we do not know who Samuel Cabot Construction is. We are responding to EPA's request as if it were addressed to Samuel Cabot Incorporated.

Many of the questions are identical to EPA's 1994 information request for the Turchin Junkyard, and we consulted our answer ("1994 Response") to that request in responding to these questions.

- b. Nature of Operations at Each Location
 - i. Chelsea, MA (Gihlstorff, 1994 Response)

Still Operation:

1877 - 1976 with a short interruption for rebuilding after the Great Chelsea Fire in 1908. The Company purchased coal tar from Boston Edison and transported the material in Company ships to Cabot's Chelsea location where it was distilled into creosote oil and pitch. The pitch was sold as a roofing material while the creosote oil was used in the manufacture of wood stain and other consumer products such as tree healing paint, tasgon, gutter paint, and so forth. The still operation was discontinued in 1976 and dismantled in 1979.

Prior to 1975, the manufacture of wood stain consisted of collecting a variety of combustible solvents (mineral spirits, kerosene, heavy aromatic naphtha, and oils such as creosote oil, linseed oil, fish oil, and pigments) in a chaser mill where the ingredients were mixed and blended with some size reduction also occurring and commonly referred to as "grinding."

The manufacturing procedure from 1975 to the close of the plant in 1985 used a high-speed disperser to mix and blend the same ingredients; however, no size reduction occurred.

Following the mixing, blending, and grinding procedure, other rheological ingredients were added as the batch was standardized. Once the product was standardized for color and specific gravity, it was packaged in pint, quart, gallon, 5-gallon, and 55-gallon containers.

ii. Newburyport, MA (Anderson, Gihlstorff)

This plant has been in operation since 1985. Because of its design to control and prevent pollution, it is considered to be a "state-of-the-art" facility. The plant uses high-speed dispersers to mix and blend the various ingredients to produce a wide range of wood stain including opaque stains, semi-solid stains, semi-transparent stains, decking stains, and PTW stains.

c. Chemical Constituents at the Site (Anderson, Gourlay)

Chemical constituents on EPA Enclosure F which were produced, processed or used in Samuel Cabot operations or present in materials produced, processed or used in our operations are:

C9-C18 aliphatic hydrocarbons. Aluminum, chromium, cobalt, lead, magnesium, mercury, calcium, copper, iron, and manganese. Methyl isobutyl ketone (MIBK).

d. Changes in Operations (Anderson, 1994 Response)

See "b" above. Our major products manufactured include stains and paints. See also "3e."

e. List of Products (Gihlstorff, 1994 Response)

A list of the products manufactured by Samuel Cabot Incorporated is enclosed. See Appendix I.

The Chelsea and Newburyport sites manufactured the whole range of Cabot products in the Company's line of products at the time of their operation.

f. Types of Raw Materials Used (Anderson, Gihlstorf, 1994 Response)

The manufacture of wood stain involves the use of combustible solvents, pigments, driers, oils, and other rheological ingredients.

Beginning in about 1983, we recycled wash solvent into subsequent batches which are compatible in color and formulation.

g. Cleaning & Maintenance of Equipment (Gihlstorf, 1994 Response)

i. The cleaning of the chaser mills and dispersers is accomplished by withholding a small amount of mineral spirits from the batch to be used in the cleanup. The mills and dispersers are flushed with this solvent until they are clean, and the solvent is then pumped back into the batch and becomes part of the final formulation. Filters and fillers are cleaned by flushing with mineral spirits, and the spent solution is sent to a holding tank where it is used in subsequent batches. We do not have information on how the Chelsea still was cleaned.

ii. The amount used annually depends on the number of batches made per year. From 1980 – 1985 our plants averaged between 750 and 1,100 batches per year. Batches were typically 1,000 gallons or less, but some may have been up to 3,000 gallons. We have no information before 1980.

h. Spill Clean-Up Methods (Gihlstorf)

There were no spills in the Newburyport plant during the period being investigated other than occasional, minor operational spills which were cleaned up using Speedi-Dri and/or rags. This material would then have been put into the trash, used in the process, or, if hazardous waste, sent to Ashland Chemical or Triumvirate Environmental. At Chelsea, minor operational spills would have been dealt with the same way after 1980. Before 1980, they may have been mixed with sawdust, concrete or Speed-Dri and disposed of in the trash.

Chelsea, MA - Spill #1 (1994 Response)

i. Type of Materials Spilled

September 12, 1973: A spill of coal tar from a holding tank at the Chelsea site apparently caused by a disgruntled employee in the nighttime. Cleanup by the Morelli Maintenance Corp., 385 Elliott Street, Newton Upper Falls, MA 02164 and Coastal Services, 22 River Street, Braintree, MA 02184.

4. Wastes & Waste Streams

a. Waste Survey (Papenfuss)

b. Each Type of Waste from Samuel Cabot Incorporated's Operations (Papenfuss)

- A. Asbestos Pipe Insulation from Remodeling: White solid, 4 ft from disposal each in 1984 and 1985.
- B. Naphthalene: Off-white solid; odor unknown; 65 yd. for disposal in 1981.
- C. Waste Stains/Sawdust: Mixture of off-spec stains and sawdust to form a solid of various colors of gray, brown, red, and blue consisting of mineral spirits, linseed oil, inert pigments with a mild solvent smell; 1,756 drums from 1983-1985.

- D. Latex Wash Water: Liquid with very low solids, cloudy gray and brown color; slight ammonia smell; 75 drums and 1,750 gallons from 1984-1985.
- E. Wash Solvents: Low solids liquid with mineral spirits, kerosene, and high aromatic naphtha; gray/brown color; mild solvent smell; 3,500 gallons from 1985.
- F. Mixed Solvents: Clear liquid with solvent smell of mineral spirits and high aromatic naphtha; 4,129 gallons from 1985.
- G. Sawdust/Linseed Oil: Amber liquid with sawdust to form a solid; mild odor; 76 drums from 1984-1985.
- H. Off-Spec Stain: Gray/brown liquid with some solids consisting of mixed petroleum solvents, linseed oil, alkyd resin, inert pigments; mild solvent odor; 3,932 gallons in 1984.
- I. Tank Bottoms: High viscosity dark brown/black liquid mixture of asphalt and coal tar; petroleum smell; 233 drums from 1983.
- J. Oily Dirt from Spill: Mixture of dirt and heavy petroleum distillates; dark brown to black in color with a petroleum smell; 68,360 lbs. and 40 yd. from 1983.
- K. Tank Cleanings: Viscous dark brown petroleum-based sludge with a petroleum smell; 60 drums and 600 gallons from 1981 and 1983.
- L. Oil/Water from Spill: Mixture of petroleum distillates and water; two-phase with a petroleum smell; 9,600 gallons from 1983.
- M. Fiber Drums: Brown Kraft paper fiber drums previously used for shipping and storing various liquid and solid raw materials. Empty drums put into dumpster for disposal by trash hauler, BFI or others. Amounts and dates unknown.
- N. Steel Cans, Pails, Drums: Damaged and dirty one-gallon cans from production, damaged and dirty five-gallon pails from production, and raw material usage and a few damaged 55-gallon drums from raw material usage. Empty containers put into the dumpster for disposal by trash hauler, BFI or others. Amounts and dates unknown.
- O. Corrugated Packaging: Brown and white corrugated Kraft paper packaging materials from in-house use, raw material shipments, and supply shipments. Materials were put into dumpster for disposal by trash hauler, BFI or others. Amounts and dates unknown.
- P. Plastic Wrap: Clear and colored polyethylene stretch wrap and shrink wrap from raw material pallets. Material was put into the

dumpster for disposal by trash hauler, BFI or others. Amounts and dates unknown.

- Q. Paper Bags: Brown and white Kraft multi-wall paper bags from shipments of dry powdered raw materials. Bags were put into dumpster for disposal by trash hauler, BFI or others. Amounts and dates unknown.
- R. Speedi-Dri Absorbent: Used to clean up various oil and stain spills, when dry, material was placed into dumpster for disposal by trash hauler, BFI or others. Amounts and dates unknown.
- S. Cotton Rags: Used to wipe up small spills and wipe oil, grease, and stain off equipment. Usually soaked in water to prevent spontaneous combustion before being put into dumpster for disposal by trash hauler, BFI or others. Amounts and dates unknown.

We do not have information for periods before 1980.

- c. Description of how Waste was Collected & Stored Prior to Disposal (Gihlstorf, 1994 Response)

Waste described in "b" above was collected in 55-gallon drums and either mixed with sawdust to solidify the contents or the drum was pumped into a larger tanker and then transported. Waste drums were stored on cement floors. Regular trash was collected and disposed of in a dumpster.

- e. Waste Containers (Papenfuss)

For most of the periods we do not have information. For materials on manifest:

In order of decreasing volume, waste was shipped in 55-gallon drums, tank trucks, dumpsters, bags, and cartons.

The drums were black open-head 17H drums. Very few were any other color. There were no distinctive markings on the drums. The only labeling would be the standard hazardous waste label with the Company name and address, EPA ID number, content description, and UN/NA number. Most of these drums were purchased from a drum recycler with a limited number coming from the use of raw materials in the plant.

The tank trucks were the standard over-the-road, 5,000-7,000 gallon capacity tankers as supplied by the waste haulers.

The dumpsters used were 30 yd., open top, roll off containers as supplied by the waste hauler.

Very small shipments of asbestos were contained in poly bags. Lab pack chemicals were contained in corrugated and wooden cartons.

f. Contracts/Agreements for Waste Disposal (Papenfuss)

Typically, a licensed handler of hazardous waste is contacted and told of a waste needing disposal. As a rule, there is no contract or agreement beyond the understanding they are licensed and insured to handle the particular waste. BFI contract dated 1985 included. We have no information for earlier periods.

g. Copies of Contracts/Agreements (Gihlstorf)

h. Locations Where Waste was Sent (Doherty, Gihlstorf, Papenfuss)

1950-1985 - Chelsea: Attempts to locate information on Chelsea trash hauler have failed. The trash hauler was purchased by a larger company, and we cannot determine the buyer. Empty barrels were on occasion sent to American Barrel on Canter Street in Chelsea, Massachusetts. Mr. Doherty and Mr. Gihlstorf recall that in 1980 there were several hundred barrels with wash solvent that had been collected over the years at the Chelsea plant. The wash solvent was subsequently used in the manufacturing process, and the number of barrels then was reduced by shipments to American Barrel.

1985 - Newburyport: Browning Ferris Industries (BFI). Plant trash was sent to either the incinerator in North Andover, MA, or to a Boston-area collection point for further disposal. See Appendix III.

s. How Samuel Cabot Incorporated Managed Pickups of Waste (Papenfuss, Doherty)

Waste was segregated by type. When a determination was made that the material had no rework potential, the decision was made to dispose of it. A waste handler would be called for a quote if it was a new waste stream. If the price was agreeable, a call would be made for pickup and disposal of the waste. When an invoice for the pickup and disposal was received, the Accounting Dept. would issue a check after a signoff by the appropriate staff member. The check was sent directly to the waste carrier. See enclosed invoices for the amount of each check.

No records were kept of who was contacted at the waste carriers' business for pickup. No records are kept of which person in accounting issues which checks, so we do not know which individual paid which bills. Checks are sent to the waste carrier and only indicate a company name and address, not an individual name.

For barrels, we believe calls were made to American Barrel when there were empty barrels which the Company wished to send for reworking.

t. Individual/Organization who Selected Location of Waste Disposal (Papenfuss)

In all cases, the waste carrier picked the location where the wastes were to be taken.

Samuel Cabot Company, on Marginal Street, Chelsea, MA - producers of paints and stains. There was a weekly pickup of approximately 100 to 150 barrels. These barrels were transported to the Whitney Barrel Company in Woburn to be reconditioned and recycled.

of Stoneham, MA,
of Woburn, MA, and of Burlington are three of the drivers that he recalls that drove for the company. also worked inside in the processing of the barrels. Other names of former employees that Mr. Whitney recalled are and might be deceased. There were quite a few transient drivers over the years, he will informed me if any of the names resurface. Mr. Whitney further states that the Whitney Barrel Company was a "small outfit" that processed approximately 400 to 500 barrels daily.

The recycling / reconditioning process was described as follows: The barrels would be brought to the site by trucks. They would be off-loaded into what was known as the "raw warehouse", the building that was located in the back of the site. There the barrels would be externally washed, basically like a car wash. The cleaning solution was a mixture of boiling hot water and trisodium- phosphate (TSP). This was referred to as a stronger version of the Tide product.

The barrels are then moved to the "internal wash cycle." The barrels are turned upside down and placed in a tank where water jets come up from the tanks and the boiling hot water spray and steam would clean the inside of the barrels. The residual water in the barrels would then be syphoned out. Any residue and water used in the cleaning processed flowed out to the MDC sewer.

The barrels are now prepared for the external painting. After being painted, the barrels are moved to te finishing warehouse. This is the final step in the reconditioning / recycling process, before delivering them to the customer.

Mr. Whitney stated that, absolutely, no barrels were picked up that had any residue in them. Some of the companies washed their barrels out before we picked them up. All barrels were virtually empty. There was slight residue on the sides of some of the barrels.

Burning or blasting of the barrels was not a part of their process.
