NOTICE OF INTENT TO ISSUE CLEAN AIR ACT PART 49 TRIBAL MINOR NEW SOURCE REVIEW PERMIT

The U. S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requests public comment on the draft minor New Source Review Permit for G&K Services, Inc. (Permit No. SYN-ON-5500900021-2014-01) located in Green Bay, Wisconsin. The permit establishes synthetic minor emission limits on volatile organic compound (VOC) and hazardous air pollutant (HAP) emissions and authorizes the replacement of one industrial washer, three industrial dryers, and a steam tunnel at the facility located at 800 Isbell Street, Green Bay, Wisconsin, within the exterior boundaries of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin's reservation. The permit contains all the Clean Air Act requirements that apply to the source and requires that the source conduct monitoring sufficient to enable EPA and the public to determine whether the source is complying with the applicable air quality requirements. The anticipated date for the issuance of the draft permit is **September 15, 2014**.

Written comments and requests to receive notices of any future actions may be sent to George Czerniak, Director, Air and Radiation Division (A-18J), at the above EPA Region 5 office address or faxed to (312) 692-2031 by **October 15, 2014**. All written comments should include the reason for interest in the draft permit, requested actions for EPA to take, and the justification for such actions. All comments should include sufficient specificity and regulatory references to allow EPA to investigate the merits of the position.

Members of the public may also request a public hearing. A request for a public hearing must be made in writing and must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised at

the hearing. Written requests for a public hearing should be sent to the EPA address listed above.

All relevant comments received prior to the end of the public comment period will be considered in arriving at a final decision on the permit. All comments will be included in the public docket without change and may be made available to the public, including any personal information provided, unless the comment includes Confidential Business Information (CBI) or other information whose disclosure is restricted by statute. Information that you consider CBI or otherwise protected should be clearly identified as such and should not be submitted through e-mail. If you send e-mail directly to EPA, your e-mail address will be captured automatically and included as part of the public comment. Please note that an e-mail or postal address must be provided with your comments if you wish to receive direct notification of EPA's final decision regarding the permit and its responses to comments submitted during the public comment period. The final permit is a public record that can be obtained upon request. A statement of reasons for changes made to the draft permit and responses to comments received will be sent to all persons who commented on the draft permits. If you believe any condition of the draft permit is inappropriate or that our initial decision to deny an application, terminate a permit, or prepare a draft permit is inappropriate, you must raise all reasonably ascertainable issues and submit all reasonably ascertainable arguments supporting your position by the end of the comment period.
