Activity	<p><u>Weston/START Submerged Oil Branch Task Force Group (SOTF) Team Activity:</u></p> <p>SOTF#2 Jonathan Roubik (START), Team Lead Eric Oleson, and Leica operator Eric Celebreeze performed (or attempted) poling at 40 locations in focus areas 33.00A, 33.00B, 33.15T, 33.25 and the Delta. Poling activities had 1 location that produced an overall submerged oil category of heavy sheen concentration (D-120609-B-01). 6 locations produced moderate sheen (33.25-B-01, 33.00A-B-09, 33.00A-B-04, 33.00A-B-19, D-120609-B-02 and D-120609-B-03). 25 locations produced an overall submerged oil category of light sheen and 3 locations produced no sheen. 5 locations were dry and unable to be poled.</p> <p>Data for all sites was collected following a temperate reading. (See field log for details) Sediment temperatures ranged from 55.6.0 to 75.3 degrees F, above sediment temperatures ranged from 64.8 to 78.0 degrees F, and surface water temperatures ranged from 67.8 to 80.0 degrees F.</p>

Comments	Sheen was collected by use of soft boom and absorbent pads during poling ops. Boats used in areas where moderate or heavy sheen was observed were wiped with absorbent pads for decontamination onsite at the end of the day.
