Ottawa Township Flat Glass Site

Site Name: Ottawa Township Flat Glass Site

Size: Approximately 400 acres

Supported Site Uses: Commercial and industrial land uses

Existing Site Infrastructure: All major utilities are available at two on-site production facilities, which include glass manufacturing buildings and warehouses.

Readiness for Use: In continued use: The site is occupied by a large architectural glass manufacturer and a chemical company (leasing warehouse space).

Future use: Further environmental testing is needed to determine future use of a quarry and disposal areas adjacent to Illinois River.



Naplate, Illinois

The site is located to the immediate south of the Village of Naplate, La Salle County, Illinois, and adjacent to the Illinois River.

SETTING:

- The site is zoned for industrial land uses.
- Surrounding land uses include residential and commercial development in the Town of Naplate, a graveyard, and two open pit mines operated by U.S. Silica.
- The Illinois River bisects the site from east to west.
- Population of Naplate, IL: 523 people.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- The Ottawa Flat Glass Site is a Superfund Alternative site, a site that requires long-term response and is eligible to be placed on the National Priorities List but is not listed.

REMEDIAL STATUS:

- The site owner is conducting ongoing environmental testing to determine the type and extent of on- and off-site contamination.
