Extended Comment Period
for the
Proposed Clinton Landfill PCB Disposal
Clinton, Illinois

Comment Period Now Open until Aug. 14, 2011

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is proposing to issue a chemical waste approval for the disposal of polychlorinated biphenyls, or PCBs, at the Clinton Landfill in rural Clinton. An investigation by the EPA determined the proposed PCB disposal cell does not present an unreasonable risk to human health and the environment. The EPA regulates PCB disposal under the federal Toxic Substances Control Act. Before the Agency makes a final decision, it will extend the previous comment period that started on March 15 and ended on June 15, 2011, an additional 45 days to end at **midnight, Aug. 14, 2011**.
