# BASF FINA Petrochemicals LP, NAFTA Region Olefins Complex Prevention of Significant Deterioration Permit for Greenhouse Gas Emissions PSD-TX-903-GHG

**Summary of Revisions in Final Permit** 

U.S. Environmental Protection Agency August 17, 2012

### **Summary of the Formal Public Participation Process**

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region 6 (EPA) proposed to issue a Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) permit to the BASF FINA Petrochemicals LP (BFLP), NAFTA Region Olefins Complex on April 26, 2012. The public comment period on the draft permit began April 26, 2012 and closed on May 26, 2012. EPA announced the public comment period through a public notice published in *The Port Arthur News* on April 26, 2012 and on Region 6's website. EPA also notified agencies and municipalities on April 26, 2012 in accordance with 40 CFR Part 124.

The Administrative Record for the draft permit was made available at EPA Region 6's office. EPA also made the draft permit, Statement of Basis and other supporting documentation available on Region 6's website, the Groves Public Library in Groves, TX, and the Port Arthur Public Library in Port Arthur, TX.

EPA's public notice for the draft permit also provided the public with notice of the public hearing. The public notice stated that "Any requests for a public hearing must be received by EPA by email or mail by May 23, 2012, and must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing...EPA has the right to cancel a public hearing if no request for a public hearing is received by May 23, 2012 or EPA determines that there is not significant interest. If the hearing is cancelled, EPA will post an announcement of the cancellation by May 29, 2012 on EPA's website <a href="http://yosemite.epa.gov/r6/Apermit.nsf/AirP">http://yosemite.epa.gov/r6/Apermit.nsf/AirP</a>. Individuals may also call the EPA at the above contact number to determine if the public hearing has been cancelled." EPA did not receive any written comments concerning the draft permit during the comment period, and did not receive any written requests for a public hearing. EPA posted its announcement that there would not be a hearing on May 29, 2012.

#### **Revisions in Final Permit**

The following is a list of administrative and clarifying changes for the BASF Fina Petrochemicals LP (BFLP), NAFTA Region Olefins Complex (PSD-TX-903-GHG) Prevention of Significant Deterioration Permit, Final Permit Conditions.

### 1. Cover Sheet

The cover sheet titled "Prevention of Significant Deterioration Permit for Greenhouse Gas Emissions Issued Pursuant to the Requirements at 40 CFR §52.21" has been modified to state the following:

In accordance with 40 CFR §124.15(b)(3), this PSD Permit becomes effective 30 days after the service of notice of this final decision unless review is requested on the permit pursuant to 40 CFR §124.19 immediately upon issuance of this final decision.

This administrative change is made as a result of not receiving any comments during the comment period related to this action.

## **Endangered Species Act**

The Endangered Species Act information provided in the Statement of Basis has changed. In the original Statement of Basis dated March 1'2012, EPA previously determined that the issuance of the permit would not affect the hawksbill sea turtle (*Eretmochelys imbricata*) and the leatherback sea turtle (*Dermochelys coricea*), but issuance of the permit may affect, but would not likely adversely affect the piping plover (*Charadrius melodus*), the green sea turtle (*Chelonia mydas*), and Kemp's ridley sea turtle (*Lepidochelys kempii*). Following a request to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration's National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) for concurrence with that determination, NMFS requested, by letter dated June 22, 2012, additional analysis of impacts of air emissions and wastewater discharges on potentially "affected" endangered marine species due to the project. BASF and their consultants, Whitenton Group, Inc. and RPS Group, Plc ("RPS"), responded by submitting information as an Addendum to the Biological Assessment (BA) on August 1, 2012.

Based on the new information contained in the Addendum, EPA now determines that issuance of the permit will have no effect on the piping plover, the green sea turtle, and Kemp's ridley sea turtle. EPA will withdraw its request for concurrence from NMFS and USFWS with a notification to the agencies.
