**ANNONCEMENT OF PROPOSED PERMIT AND PUBLIC HEARING, AND REQUEST
FOR PUBLIC COMMENT OF PROPOSED CLEAN AIR ACT GREENHOUSE GAS
PREVENTION OF SIGNIFICANT DETERIORATION PRECONSRUCTION PERMIT**

Public Comment Period March 21, 2012 – April 21, 2012

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) provides notice of and requests public comment on the EPA's proposed action relating to the Prevention of Significant Deterioration (PSD) permit application for the ETC Jackson County Gas Plant. EPA is issuing notice of a draft PSD permit for the ETC facility that if finalized would regulate the greenhouse gas air pollutant emissions associated with the project to construct four natural gas processing plants and associated compression equipment in accordance with the PSD regulation (40 CFR 52.21). The project is located near Ganado, TX 77962 at the following coordinates: 29°6'34.46" N, -96°32'15.52" W.

EPA concludes that ETC's application is subject to PSD review for the pollutant GHGs, as the project will result in increased greenhouse gas emissions for a facility described at 40 CFR 52.21 (b)(49)(iv). The proposed project consists of the construction of four natural gas processing plants and associated compression equipment. Each of the four natural gas processing plants is in turn comprised of the following emissions sources: two dual-drive inlet gas compressor engines, an amine unit controlled by a thermal oxidizer, a cryogenic unit, a molecular sieve dehydration unit, three electric-driven refrigeration compressors, a triethylene glycol (TEG) dehydration unit, controlled by a thermal oxidizer, three natural gas-fired residue gas compressor engines, three natural gas-fired heaters, fugitives from associated piping/equipment leaks, and engine blowdown and starter vents controlled by a flare. EPA region 6 implements a Greenhouse Gas (GHG) PSD Federal Implementation Plan (FIP) for Texas under the provisions of 40 CFR 52.21 (except paragraph (a)(1)). *See 40 CFR 52.2305*

Any interested individual may submit written comments on EPA's proposed PSD permit for the project. All written comments on EPA's proposed action must be received by EPA via e-mail by April 21, 2012, or postmarked by April 21, 2012. All comments on the draft permit must be received in writing by e-mail or postmarked by April 21, 2012 to the address above. EPA will respond to and consider comments in making the final decision regarding the issuing of the permit. Similar comments may be grouped together in the response, and EPA will not respond to individual commenters directly.

Additionally, all comments will be included in the public docket without change, and may be made available to the public, including any personal information provided, unless the comment includes Confidential Business Information or other information whose disclosure is restricted by statute. Thus, confidential business information or other protected information should be clearly identified as such, and should not be submitted through e-mail. Any e-mails sent directly to the EPA, will capture your e-mail address automatically and will be included as part of the public comment. *Please note that an e-mail or postal address must be provided with your comments if you wish to receive direct notification of EPA's final decision regarding the permit, and responses to comments submitted during the public comment period.*

An extension of the 30-day comment period may be granted if the request for an extension adequately demonstrates why additional time is required to prepare comments.

Public Hearing: If there is a significant amount of public interest in the draft permit, EPA has discretion to hold a public hearing. Any requests for a public hearing must be received by EPA by email or mail by April 19, 2012, and must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Attendance at the public hearing is not required in order to submit written comments. *If the EPA determines that there is significant public interest*, a public hearing will be held on April 26, 2012 from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the following location:

If a public hearing is held, the public comment period shall automatically be extended to the close of the public hearing. EPA has the right to cancel a public hearing if no request for a public hearing is received by April 19, 2012 or EPA determines that there is not significant interest. *If the hearing is canceled*, EPA will post an announcement of the cancellation by April 23, 2012 on EPA's website <http://yosemite.epa.gov/r6/Apermit.nsf/AirP>. Individuals may also call the EPA at the above contact number to determine if the public hearing has been cancelled.

Permit Documents: EPA's draft permit, EPA's preliminary determination and statement of basis, ETC's permit application and supporting documentation, and comments received from the public, other government agencies, and the applicant during the public comment period become part of the administrative record for the permit. In addition all data submitted by the applicant is available as a part of the administrative record.
